TRANSITION YEAR CONTRACT 2017/18


Transition Year is a crucial year in the development of all students in Newpark. It allows the students to grow emotionally, socially, physically and academically. The key to success in Transition Year is to push yourself as hard as you can in all areas and try as many new subjects / activities as possible.

We would ask that all students commit to this contract for the coming year:

- I commit to being punctual to all activities, to school and to all outside school parts of the programme, e.g. Community Action, Work Experience etc.
- I will endeavour to leave everyone that I come in contact with from outside and inside the Newpark community with the best impression of the school and myself as possible.
- I will embrace all of the diversity and change that I come upon in TY, I will show respect and be courteous to everyone I come in contact with.

This contract covers all trips extra to the general day to day curriculum of the school. I give permission for my Son / Daughter to attend any trips that TY encompasses. If there is something that I do not wish my Son / Daughter to attend I will inform his/her Form Teacher via a note in their journal.

COMMUNITY ACTION AND ACTIVITY WEEKS

Each student is required to take part in a Community Action programme. Failure to complete Community Action or Activity Weeks will result in a loss of credits at the end of the module as well as other sanctions in line with school policy.

COMMUNITY ACTION

Community Action is an important part of the TY Programme and is compulsory for all students. Students are required to volunteer their services every Tuesday afternoon after school, (for the duration of the school year) with a voluntary service of their choice which would be of benefit to their local community. This can be organised at a suitable time of choosing either.

Examples of Community Action undertaken in the past are volunteering in Charitable Organisations, Homework Clubs, Youth Groups, Church Groups, Nursing Homes, Tidy Towns etc.)

Students should choose one Community Action which they will undertake for the year. **STUDENTS MAY NOT UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES COMPLETE COMMUNITY ACTION WITHIN CLASS TIME**.

Each week, upon completion of Community Action, the school journal Community Action report should be signed by the person within the organisation responsible for the student. At the end of each module a Community Action Module review card will be sent out and will need to be returned before credits are awarded.

ACTIVITY WEEKS

Students are also required to participate in all activity weeks both within the school and outside the school.

There are 2 Activity weeks in each module., 6 in total. Each must be written up in detail and are awarded credits in each module

- 3 x Work Experience
- 1 x In Dublin Week
- 1 x Arts Week
- 1 x Gartan OEC

WORK EXPERIENCE

Students are required to undertake 3 Work Experience weeks, one in each module.

Work Experience is an important part of the TY Programme. Students should take the time to try to find a Work Experience in and area they have an interest in. As there are a lot of schools that undertake Work Experience it is important to make enquiries about your Work Experience as soon as possible in order to avoid disappointment.

All required forms will be sent out digitally over the course of the modules. They should be returned by email to your form teacher. All Community Action and Work Experience forms are available on the school website.



Newpark Comprehensive School Policy for School Trips

All Parents / Guardians of students in Transition Year should make themselves aware of Newpark's School Policy on trips. It can be found by following the following link:

"The school expects that all students travelling on an extended tour will display a level of maturity commensurate with their age. Students on trips, which involve an overnight stay in Ireland or abroad cannot be supervised on a 24 hour basis and all extended school tours will involve periods of time without direct supervision. Parents who are concerned that such a level of supervision is inadequate should not permit their son / daughter to take part in such trips"

Policy adopted 13th June 2012.

Once students have been settled and sent to their rooms in the evening they should only re-emerge if there is an emergency. This may lead to serious consequences should it occur.

On the morning of departure the bus will depart at 7:30am SHARP, please be there at least 10 minutes in advance of this.

On arrival back in Dublin the bus will drop students in Parnell Square at approx. 5:30pm, students are required to make their own arrangements to get home from there.

A very important part of TY is that you *reflect* on new experiences, to make the most of them. Being able to look back on your experiences and efforts to see how you did, give yourself credit and imagine how you could do better, is an essential skill of being an adult.

The TY Eportfolio is the place where you will collect your plans, memories and reflections throughout Transition Year. It takes the form of an online OneNote Notebook divided into sections under the headings below. Each module you will gradually fill it up, using not just text but also photos, videos and links to illustrate all that you have experienced and the effect it has had on you. Many students say that their best experiences of Newpark are from their time in Transition Year, so it is worth making your Eportfolio a digitial document that you will treasure, giving an in-depth picture of yourself in this pivotal year.

Your form teacher will guide you through how to use OneNote, and you will have one period a week in the computer room to work away on it. Every Thursday you will upload your guest speaker write-up, and there will be a deadline towards the end of each module for all sections of that module's Eportfolio to have been completed in full. 



I.T. IN TRANSITION YEAR

As part of Transition Year you will receive a school email address and an Office 365 login.

SCHOOL EMAIL:

All important information about activities, deadlines, changes of plans etc will be communicated to your school email by your form teacher, so it is vital that you check your school email **every day**. This is just a habit you need to get into in TY. There is a lot more information given to you this year than you are used to, about a wide variety of different things on a daily basis, so if you do not check your email you will simply not be able to keep up.

OFFICE 365 LOGIN AND ONENOTE:

This is a username and password to be kept carefully as it gives you access to Microsoft OneNote, for your TY Eportfolio. You will have one period a week in the computer room with your form teacher to learn how to use and make the most of OneNote for your Eportfolio. It can also be accessed from anywhere via the internet, the OneNote desktop app, or the OneNote smartphone app. The OneNote Notebook has all the sections of your Eportfolio for you to fill up (see separate section on this), which only you and your form teacher can see. There is also a 'Content Library' where your form teacher can share documents with the whole group. In addition your login allows you full access to Word, Powerpoint, Excel, Sway and cloud storage on Onedrive.
