First Year English Revision List

Poetry — Choose 4 poems studied in class this year and make notes for yourself using the following guidelines.

- The title of each poem and who wrote it.
- What happened in each poem?
- What kind of language and poetic techniques are used?
- What's the main message?
- Did you like the poem or not? What impression did it make on you? Explain why.
- What is the mood of the poem?

For all of the above you need to be able to support your points with quotes.

Fiction — Revise one of the novels you studied in class this year by making notes under the following headings.

- The way the novel begins and ends and what I thought of the beginning and ending.
- A character I liked. A character I disliked. A character I found interesting. You must be able to explain in detail why you felt this way about each character using examples from the novel to prove your points.
- Describe an exciting scene, a happy scene and a scene which made you feel sad. You must be able to explain clearly why each scene made you feel this way giving specific examples from the novel.
- Choose a main theme and trace how it is developed from the beginning through the middle and to the end of the novel. For example you could examine how the theme of *Growing Up* is developed in *Wonder* and show how Auggie changed a lot during the story.

Skills- Punctuation and spelling.

- Know how to use capital letters, full-stops, commas, apostrophes and speech marks
- Correct spelling mistakes and learn to spell key words.

Comprehending questions

On the exam there will be an unseen poem or text (an article or an extract from a novel) followed by comprehension questions. You can't revise for this but you can learn the tactics:

- Read the questions carefully and underline key words to make sure you know what you are being asked – then answer the question asked!
- Answer in full, clear sentences
- Include as many relevant points as you can in each answer
- Back up your points with examples from the text

If you work your way through this list over the coming weeks you will be very well prepared for your summer exam. Good luck!
