### **4. For the writing:**

Revise the different types of writing: message, email, postcard, diary, letter, opinion piece, reaction writing, récit. (Revise chapters 1-5 Tout Va Bien pages 14, 49, 65-69, 91-92, 93-94, 108-111, 133-135, 137-139, 174-175, 187-190)

Learn useful phrases for each type of writing

Revise all the grammar we have done and how to use it in context.

Practise planning written pieces making sure they are well structured with a beginning, middle and end.

Remember to work out your own strong points and use whatever techniques work for your particular learning style when revising - everybody's different.

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
